MEMO: Important COVID Updates for SSM Campus: Surge of COVID-19
Triggers Additional Mandatory Measures in Algoma and in the Municipality of
Sault Ste. Marie

TO: All SSM Students, Staff and Faculty

Due to a recent surge in confirmed cases of COVID-19 reported across the Algoma Region and Sault Ste. Marie, Algoma Public Health (APH) is increasing area public health measures, including imposing capacity limits and physical distancing requirements at local businesses. Monday, November 15, 2021 - Algoma Public Health Update: Surge of COVID-19 Triggers Additional Mandatory Measures in Algoma and in the Municipality of Sault Ste. Marie

In response to rapidly rising COVID-19 cases in Algoma, and especially in the municipality of Sault Ste. Marie, Algoma Public Health is taking further action to curb the spread of the virus, prevent severe illness and death in our communities, and protect health system capacity.

Algoma's Medical Officer of Health, with the support of the provincial Chief Medical Officer of Health, is taking the following three actions.

- 1. Legally ordering anyone in Algoma who has confirmed or suspected COVID-19 infection, or who is identified as a close contact to follow isolation requirements and other public health direction.
- 2. Requiring Sault Ste. Marie businesses and organizations to reinstate recently lifted provincial capacity limits and physical distancing requirements, and strengthening masking requirements both indoors and outdoors.
- 3. Requiring anyone aged 12 years and older in Algoma to provide proof of identification and vaccination if they are entering an indoor facility to actively participate in, coach, officiate, volunteer, or spectate at an organized sport.
